Civil War Soldiers

In this newsletter, we will feature two local men, who were Civil War soldiers and are buried in the old Gilead Cemetery, Henry B. Garvin and Samuel H. Booher. The Garvin's were a well-known family of the Canmer community.

Henry Baskin Garvin

Henry B. was the son of David and Melvina (Richardson) Garvin. Henry was one of several children in this family. He was born January 9, 1834 and died July 22, 1877. He joined the Confederate Army on November 19, 1861 at Cave City, Kentucky. He was in the 6th KY Inf. Company D.

He served until rising from Pvt. to first sergeant at the time of his discharge. He fought in Vicksburg. They were in a heavy battle at Jonesboro on August 31, 1864, where they lost several men. Many of their group was captured here. The remainder of the company spent the winter in Dalton, Georgia.

They were in the delaying tactics of Sherman's march to the sea. Col. Joseph H. Lewis of Glasgow was their leader. Their losses were heavy. They lost 180 men, 94 killed, 3 were missing, three died in prison camps, and 80 died of diseases and illnesses. Nine were still in

prison camps, when their enlistment was up.

Two of the men that were prisoners were killed on the way home, when the over-crowded steam boat exploded and burned north of Memphis, Tennessee.

Henry B. is buried in the old Gilead Cemetery, along with his parents and seven brothers and sisters. One wonders of all the stories that could be told by these men, who are buried in this old cemetery.

Samuel H. Booher

The Booher family came from Pennsylvania to Kentucky and Tennessee. We do not know what brought them to Hart County. Samuel Booher is the only person we can find by this name buried in Hart County. He was the son of Martin and Margaret Booher and one of seven children. Samuel was born February 6, 1840 and died July, 7, 1883.

We find the family living in Clinton County in the 1860's and 1870's. In 1880, they were living in the Hardyville area with three of the Carden children with them. One wonders, if they were related, but later, we found that Mr. Booher had married Victoria Brown in Clinton county on January 12, 1864. Later, we find one of the Carden children moving to Nevada and died there. We never found any connection between the two families.

Mr. Booher was a farmer. Samuel H. fought for the Union Army, enlisting as a Pvt. and came out a Pvt. He was in the 13th Kentucky Calvary, which was put into active duty on December 22, 1863 at Columbia, Ky.

He was mustered out January 10, 1865 at Camp Nelson. Col. James H. Weathford was their commander. This group saw duty at Lebanon, Cumberland River, Creelsboro, and Celina, Tennessee. They were also at Cynthia, Canton, Mt. Sterling, Lexington, and Crab Orchid. They fought against Morgan and his men in May and June of 1864. They lost 94 men, 10 killed, 84 died of diseases. Mr. Booher is buried

near the front of the cemetery, making one to believe, he was buried there soon after the cemetery started.

The Epitaph on his stone reads, "Jesus lover of my soul, let me to thy bosom fly."

Kentucky played an important part in the Civil War. President Lincoln once stated, "I hope to have God on my side, but I must have Kentucky." If anyone has any more information on this family, please let us know.
