


HISTORIC NICHOLS SITES IN THE FALLEN TIMBER CREEK AREA

The sites listed below are located on the map shown on the following pages:

- 1. John and Nancy Nichols' home site which was torn down in the 1980's.
- 2. Nichols' spring, located on Bailey's Branch about 200 yds. from the home site.
- 3. Leroy Nichols' home site.
- 4. Charles P. Bailey home site. Later, Minnie Bailey and her husband, Hubert Huffman, lived there. Another house now built on the site.
- 5. Bowles Cemetery. John and Nancy Nichols and many of their descendants are buried here.
- 6. Will Alan Bowles cabin site (approximate).
- 7. Mount Vernon Church site.
- 8. Mount Vernon School site.
- 9. Anne (Nichols) Burch home. House currently owned by Jerry and Tammy Bailey.
- 10. Site of Willis Nichols' store and post office. (son of Thomas Nichols).
- 11. Byrd W. Nichols home site. (son of Thomas Nichols).
- 12. Elbow Spring
- 13. Site of Thomas Nichols' store and post office later run by his son, Byrd Nichols.
- 14. Approximate site of Thomas Nichols' home.
- 15. Charlie Byrd Bowles home site.
- 16. Lee Nichols home site. (son of Thomas Nichols).
- 17. Decrillion Ward home site. (son of Elizabeth Nichols Ward).
- 18. Decrillion Ward spring.
- 19. Clem Bailey home. House currently owned by Doug and Brenda Taylor.
- 20. Dudley Nichols' home site. (son of Lee Nichols).
- 21. Sewell Ward home site. (son of Decrillion Ward). House burned in the 1950's and another house now built on the site.
- 22. Abner Nichols home. House currently owned by Ralph Crews.
- 23. Nichols/Lyons Cemetery. Descendants of Abner Nichols buried here.
- 24. Approximate site of William T. Nichols' home. (son of Abner Nichols).
- 25. Dick Nichols (son of Byrd) home site. Before that thought to have been the home of Dan Stout and Mary Elizabeth Pursley.
- 26. Approximate site of Joshua Pursley home. (son of Mary Polly Nichols Pursley).
- 27. Mary Polly (Nichols) Pursley home site (approximate).
- 28. William Tolle cabin. Ruins of the cabin are still present. Six of his grandchildren married six grandchildren of John and Nancy Nichols.
