DATA SOURCES AND BIBLIOGRAPHY

Much of the public data used in compiling this manuscript were gleaned from all the usual places that genealogists tend to frequent, i.e., courthouses, libraries, historical societies, cemeteries, and various state and county archives. Worthy of special mention are the Library of Virginia in Richmond, Va., the Kentucky History Center and the Kentucky State Library Archives, both located in Frankfort, Ky., and the Filson Club in Louisville, Ky. All of these facilities provide a wonderful service to the public in making available information on marriages, birth and death records, land transactions, tax records, wills, law suits, bible records, etc. Online subscription to U.S. Census Records with both Ancestry.com and Genealogy.com were very useful in tracking the early movements of ancestors across the country. Often the sources of names and dates were family members, themselves, or other workers, and whenever possible these were checked for accuracy.
